General Information This is the first window of the series devoted to the
 significant incidents in the early life of Christ.
 Lower medallion Left panel: Nativity, right panel: Annunciation.
In the ~~upper~~ panel - the Nativity - would be devoted to Mary with the
 Infant Christ, and Joseph standing by. The shepherds might well be
 indicated at either side. Upper ~~left~~ right panel, Mary would be kneeling
 before the Angel of the Annunciation with the traditional lily symbol of
 purity, while small attendant angels would probably be represented at
 either side.
(Two of the group are now in place - The one opposite this devoted to
 Resurrection and Ascension, and the third one on this side devoted to
 Baptism and Christ among the Doctors.
