General Information As this is the only source of light in the narthex, the  
Architect feels that the design should not be dark in color. The  
subject-matter is not limited. The design should be simple and  
decorative.

the design for the narthex windows at the Church of the Holy Spirit, Lake Forest, and are sending you the color sketches herewith. I am sorry to be so long with these. The pressure of commissions is very heavy.

As planned, we have kept the windows very light, with silvery toned off-white glass through the field, accented with pure, rich color in the dominant medallions and borders.

For one pair we have indicated Noah's Ark and the Barque of Peter, with its sail inscribed with the cross, thus symbolizing the Old and New Testaments.

Dominant medallions for the other pair are suggested below, - the Phoenix rising anew from its flaming nest; and the Pelican feeding its young - ancient symbols of Our Lord's Resurrection and Sacrifice.

Secondary symbols are included below, - the lily of purity, and the rose of divine love, - the pomegranate, symbol of the Church and its fruitfulness; and the grape for the unity of the Church in relation to Our Lord, as suggested in the significant verse, "I am the Vine, ye are the branches."

We feel that this plan should work out beautifully in the actual glass, taking full benefit of what light is available.
