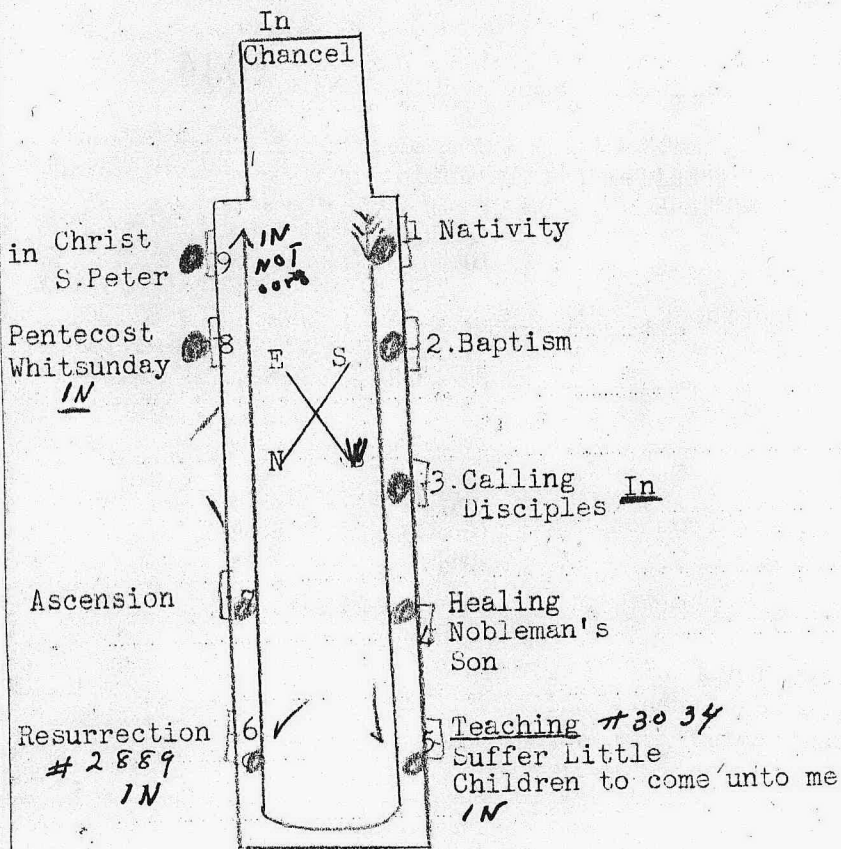

Note: The emphasis should be on the theme "Suffer Little Children to  
Come unto Me" rather than "The Blessing", so it is their wish that the  
window would show our Master receiving little children rather than blessing  
them. Also, inasmuch as Mrs. Green had eight children, it is their wish  
that there be eight children in the window and a mother. ...It was also  
suggested by them that in the grouping of the children it might be better  
to have some full face, some profile and others facing our Master with  
their backs to us."

April 22, 1950. "They had more to say about the possibility of showing more of the backs of the heads of one or two of the children. Perhaps we can turn one or two in the right panel a little more, and have them looking more upward. Reverend Underdonk didn't like the children's legs. Draw carefully in the cartoons."
