General Information Christ holding the chalice and dressed in the simple garb of His day in the center panel; and Saints Peter and John in the windows on either side - the Christ figure to predominate.

Chancel Window: As planned, Our Lord is represented as the central figure, robed in ruby, - the color of Divine Love. He holds the chalice, with one hand raised in blessing.

In the left lancet, Saint Peter bears his traditional keys, while at the right, St. John has the Evangelistic pen and book.

The fields are enriched with growing grapevines, suggesting the unity and fruitfulness of the Church, in Our Lord's significant words, - "I am the vine, ye are the branches."

Spaces at the base might contain a significant brief text, or memorial inscription, if one is required, - or it might equally well be occupied by a continuation of the basic design.

The palette is kept deep and rich, in recognition of the exposure and position of the window.

Note: The Rector would like to have the Keys held by St. Peter hung in a crossed manner.
