General Information Saint Philip and Saint James the Less.

Mr. McNamara was a Thirty-two Degree Mason, and Mrs. McNamara a member of Eastern Star, and the family would like the emblems of these Masonic orders introduced into the lower part of the panels.

North Aisle Window, Fourth from the Chancel,
the McNamara Memorial,
Saint James Church
Knoxville, Tennessee

This window is devoted to Our Lord's friends, the
Apostles Saint Philip and Saint James the Less.

Saint Philip holds his traditional symbol, the basket of
bread and the crossed staff, while Saint James the Less has
the fuller's bat, symbol of his martyrdom.

On the shields below are other symbols of the Saints.
Under Saint Paul the spear and the patriarchal cross, and
under Saint James the Less, the saw.

As in the other windows, kneeling angels hold scrolls
inscribed with the names of the Saints.

Near the base are symbols of the Thirty-Second Degree
Mason and the Eastern Star (to be developed in careful detail
in the full size drawings and the actual glass).

Across the bottom is the memorial inscription, -
"In loving memory of William T. McNamara and Wildrod McNamara".

Note: Re: Saint Philip: Change St. Philip's Square to a double cross (because we
already have the square for Thomas).
Take out the circle that St. James the Less holds - just make it the fuller's bat.

IMPORTANT NOTE: 4/18/57. O.E.S. reports: Our north window nearest the chancel is
too dark, especially in the blues. The other one is just right. We should keep
the rest of these north windows light (I have spoken to Edmund, who is cutting
them now.).
