probably not, if it works out all right.



General Information Window to be devoted to Saint Andrew and Saint George.
We should represent Saint Andrew's shield for Scotland, and the English
shield with Saint George; Near the inscription in the Saint Andrew
panel put an airplane; and the Marine symbol near the inscription in the
St. George Panel.

They like the windows in Saint Mark's School, Southboro.

We have completed our study of the design for the remaining pair of windows, and are sending it to you, herewith.

As planned, it is devoted to Saint Andrew and Saint George. Saint Andrew holds a fish and the fisherman's net, while a boat is represented near by. Saint George, in armor, holds the spear, and the conquered dragon is at his feet.

In the fields are the distinctive crosses of Saint Andrew for Scotland and Saint George for England.

A small airplane and the Marine Corps insignia are designed near the space for the memorial inscription.

These panels are planned to harmonize with those now in place. We are eager to develop them in the color and light of the actual glass, as we are confident they will take their place in your Church to excellent purpose.
