General Information There is a small Gothic-headed window on what was the stage of his theatre - it is now sort of a living room in which Colonel Buswell would like to have some color. I suggested the possibility of using three border pieces of old glass that he has. \$160, including installation.

This window is about 12 1/16 inches wide by 71 5/8 inches high, about, eight.

He also has two other pieces of old glass that he would like made into a single medallion, and strengthened and wired, to hang. The dealers who sold them to him said one group is from France, and the other is English, from Lincoln. Charge \$12.00

**Colonel Buswell's craftsman down there is going to provide the protection glass in another frame that will fit over the outside. We should send him a template of the glass with notations where one or two horizontal divisions might be made. Also send him some came lead to use at these division points.

Rough color sketch showing how your three border panels can be used in the window on the stage.

We would have to repair, strengthen and tighten the old glass, add the blue and the beaded borders for one side as well as to most of the light tinted glass between. The color spots in this light field are fragments of one of the old border pieces which will be left over, as all three are a little too tall for the window. The new glass would have an antique appearance in harmony with the old.
