We have completed our study of the Tinspon Memorial Window, and are sending you the color sketch herewith.

According to plan, it is devoted to Saint Matthew and Saint Mark. Saint Matthew holds his traditional symbol, the purse of coins as receiver of customs; while Saint Mark bears the open book inscribed with the winged lion.

The circle above is enriched with the book and pen, significant of the Gospels.

The borders are designed in the pomegranate motif, symbolizing the unity and fruitfulness of the Church.

Across the base is the memorial inscription:
"To the Glory of God and In Loving Memory of Lewis Gouverneur Tinspon and his family".

Although designed to harmonize with the Mellick Memorial Window, the arrangement of the colors is in the alternate scheme - blue appearing where red was used in the former, and red in place of the blue, thus maintaining a pleasant balance.
