General Information

Dr. Talbott writes: "I have spent considerable time studying this window, and I feel that this ought to be quite a strong window in color, probably with emphasis on the reds. I would like to see a very challenging central figure."

Window devoted to Saint Stephen:

Left panel: Saint Stephen's Ordination as Deacon;

Center panel: a magnificent figure of Stephen, "full of faith and power" doing "great wonders and miracles among the people";

Right panel: His martyrdom and his heavenly vision, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit".

Among the secondary incidents, include a symbol of Paul as being present at Stephen's martyrdom; and symbolize Stephen's eloquent speech through little figures of the Old Testament leaders he talks about, - Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses and Solomon. Also include little figures of the other deacons.
