General Information Saint Thomas and Saint Barnabas.

This window is in memory of John L. Humbard and his wife. He was an  
internationally famed road builder and globe trotter.

Saint Thomas, a great traveler and traditionally Apostle to India. His symbol is  
the carpenter's square, recalling the legend of the palace he was commanded to  
build for King Gudnaphar. While the king was on a distant journey, instead of  
building the palace on earth, he spent all the money among the poor; thus  
building a heavenly palace, which the king later saw in a vision.

Saint Barnabas, - Paul's companion on his first voyage.

We have now completed our study of the color design for the Humberd Memorial Window and are sending you the color sketch herewith. As planned, it is devoted to Saint Thomas and Saint Barnabas.

Saint Thomas, a great traveler and Apostle to India, holds his traditional symbol the carpenter's square, recalling the legend of the palace he was commanded to build for King Gudnaphar. While the King was on a distant journey, instead of building the palace on earth, he spent all the money among the poor, thus building a heavenly palace, which the King later saw in a vision. He also bears a scroll inscribed with the text, "My Lord and My God", - his answer to Jesus, (Saint John 20:28). On the shield below are inscribed the spear and arrows, instruments of his martyrdom.

Saint, Barnabas, Saint Paul's companion on his first voyage, holds the Pilgrim's staff and the Book of the Gospel of Saint Matthew which he always had with him. Below is the shield with three stones in allusion to his martyrdom. Kneeling angels hold the scroll inscribed with the names of the Saints, while other members of the angelic choir in the tracery bear censers of prayer.

At the base is the memorial inscription -

*Loving*

"In Memory of Wilma C. Humberd  
and  
John L. Humberd"

In the actual window we may find it best to insert the phrase "In Memory of" just above the first name, giving more room for the lettering.
