We have now completed our study of the design for the Bartholomew Memorial Window, and are sending the rough color sketch to you herewith/

As planned, it is devoted to the patriarch Abraham. He bears his traditional symbol, the brazier of fire and the sacrificial knife.

Below is the symbol of the sacrificial altar, recalling the proposed sacrifice of Isaac, as well as the earlier one related to his covenant with God.

We have chosen the text: "The Angel of the Lord called to him out of heaven", but if you prefer another, we shall be glad to use it.

The field and borders are designed in harmony with the first window, but the vesica shape has been omitted.

At the base, the memorial is indicated. We should like to have the exact text preferred for this.

We have also designed the companion lancet, with Isaac as the dominant figure. He carries wood for the sacrificial fire, and this theme is repeated in the symbol below.

Here we have suggested the text, "I will bless thee and all the nations of the earth."
