Templates N. Transept window is same size & shape as the Gabriel window. Blueprints.....

General Information To symbolize Saint John the Apostle  
(The two north transept windows are about 6 feet apart).

The window is about 30 feet from the ground outside.

This window will be a companion to an opal window symbolizing Saint Gabriel.

See photographs of the two south transept windows in place. This new one will go opposite the Blessed Virgin Window.

He is represented with the pen and book.

This window is devoted to Saint John the Evangelist. ~~He is represented with his usual symbol of the chalice from which emerges a serpent, recalling his miraculous deliverance from the poisoned cup.~~

The crowned shield below is inscribed with Saint John's Evangelistic symbol, - the Eagle. Around it are the first words of his Gospel, - "In Primo Est Verbum".

**NOTE:** We are to remove the chalice and snake from the Apostle's hand and place them at his feet.
