General Information The Prophet of Peace, Isaiah. Border color - red.

For the three minor medallions, represent Isaiah writing at the Lord's Command. (Isaiah, Chapter 8, "where the Lord tells him to WRITE on a large tablet.")

In the medallion below, suggest Joshua, to include the two great types of inspired leadership, associating the themes of war and peace and suggesting that, even while we battle like Joshua, there is hope in our hearts of such peace as Isaiah foresaw.

The symbol at the top to be swords and ploughshares.

See other designs made, and keep in mind the alternation of color.

We have completed our study of the design for the Isaiah window, and are sending you the color sketch herewith.

The dominant figure of Isaiah holds the prophetic scroll, and tongue and coal of fire with which the angel cleansed his lips.

In the small medallion below, he is writing at the Lord's command, and above is the symbol of the sword and plowshare. In the actual drawing, I think the plow can well be in front of the sword, to give it more prominence.

At the base, Joshua suggests the two great types of inspired leadership, associating the themes of war and peace and suggesting that, even while we battle like Joshua, there is hope in our hearts of such peace as Isaiah foresaw.

Note: Move the symbol of the Sword and Plowshares to the position below the dominant medallion - as in earlier windows. Also, in the actual drawing, have the plow in front of the sword to give the peace symbol more prominence.
