General Information Prodigal Son on Left; Good Shepherd in Center; and Good Samaritan on right.

This will be the opposite color scheme from the #3 window.

This window in the series symbolizing the Life of Our Lord is devoted to three of His significant Parables with which He emphasized the teaching of His Ministry.

At the right is the parable of the Good Samaritan, The compassionate traveler (the type of Our Lord) ministers to the unfortunate man who fell among thieves, while the Priest and Levite pass by above.

The broken sword, traditional symbol of mercy, is shown in the small quatrefoil below.

At the left is another of the significant lessons that have been represented so often in both glass and stone, - the Parable of the Prodigal Son, The repentant son kneels at the feet of the forgiving father who has come to the door to welcome him. In the background are the swine which the son had tended.

Below is the flaming rose, - traditional symbol of charity.

At the center is the great symbol of the Good Shepherd, the Parable of the Lost Sheep, - another type of Our Lord; with the pelican symbol of sacrifice below. " The Shepherd giveth His Life for the sheep".

Continuing the plan to represent members of the angelic choir, across the top are the archangels Raphael (left) with his pilgrim's staff and gourd, Uriel (center) with the flaming sun, and Jophiel (right) with his flaming sword.
