General Information Window is to memorialize Miss Long's mother, who was a great student of the Bible.

To be devoted to the Young Christ in the Temple.

Blue is the donor's favorite color - and she would like blue as the predominant color in this window.

Installed by the Unique Art Glass company, under the direction of Mr. Ed. G. Lasar, the donor of another window.

We have completed our study of the design for Miss Long's clerestory window, and are sending you the color sketch herewith.

It is, of course, a suggestion of color and light in action, and all the exquisite detail of line and form is left for development in the full size drawings and the actual glass.

As planned, it is devoted to the Young Christ in the Temple. He stands at the center in an attitude of teaching, while the learned doctors are grouped in the panels at either side.

It is designed to harmonize with the Papin Memorial window, although the principal colors, ruby and blue, are counterchanged, with lovely pure blue forming the background for the central medallion and foliated field, while the ruby recurs in the borders and backgrounds of the side medallions.
