
General Information Church is English Gothic design, with the usual square tower.

"Fishers of Men".

This narther window is to portray Christ calling men to discipleship. In the background have a symbol of Galilee, with a ship, its mast indicating the place of the cross in discipleship. The net might be in evidence. (This window will set the standard for the other windows so please do your best for us.)

We have represented Our Lord calling the disciples to be fishers of men. They are casting their net from the boat. The significance of the Cross formed by the mast and sail can be more clearly defined in the full size drawings, and the suggestion of Galilee in the background, probably at the right of the figure of Our Lord, can also be brought out clearly. The field around the medallion is enriched with foliated pattern and a place for a ~~possible~~ memorial inscription is indicated at the base. ~~If no inscription is required, the ornamental pattern can readily be continued there.~~ ... We want to make this an exquisite jewel of color and light.
