General Information harmonize with the aisle windows. To be ~~created quite simply~~ - ~~perhaps~~ with just the addition of simple symbols, - possibly the Barque of Peter and the Ark of the Covenant.

We are also sending rough color sketches for the small narthex windows, devoting them to symbols of the Old and New Testaments, - the Ark of the Covenant and Peter's Barque with the sail inscribed with the cross.

We have made a rough sketch for the single narthex window, including the symbols we have planned for the original two windows.

The Ark of the Covenant is represented above, and the Barque of Peter with the sail inscribed with the Cross, below.

As I take a last glance at it, I am inclined to think that the two symbols could well be reversed, with Peter's Barque above, thus having the emblems of the Old and New Testament read upward.

Note: Reverse symbols, so that the Barque of Peter is at the top.
