General Information A radiant figure of Christ in an attitude of ~~teach~~ welcome or teaching, with symbols at either side, of the Hand of God from the clouds, and the descending Dove, thus presenting the symbolism of the Trinity, - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Window to be of a deep and dense character of glass for its position, tho keeping in mind a rich quality to serve well on dull days. Architect writes: "...we would suggest that the glass be made quite dark and dense as the building faces the west and in the strong afternoon sun glare might easily result with the use of "thin" glass or light colored units."

We have completed the color design
for the Trinity Window, above the altar
of the First Methodist Church, Riverside,
and are sending it to you herewith

As planned, it has for its dominant
theme, the radiant figure of Christ, with
symbols in the side panels of the Hand of
God from the clouds, and the descending Dove
of the Holy Spirit, thus presenting the
symbolism of the Trinity, - Father, Son, and
Holy Spirit

The lower portion of the central panel
is enriched with the Alpha and Omega

The field is patterned in growing forms
of counter-changing color, ruby and blue,
with touches of gold and silver, stars of
heavenly steadfastness, and completed in the
grapevine motif, symbolical of the trinity, "I
am the Vine, ye are the Branches".

Underline in red on job sheet: They would like the nimbus a little smaller, and
instead of the red in it, variations of gold tones.
