...Jack Marlowe wrote: "Please don't solder joints, just tack them on kites and 1 ear on upper section; had to chisel in for upper bar, but I suppose it had to be so, almost into the cusp. Wires 2 inches down too far. This was written after setting the Sermon on the Mount.

The 8th window, or the one nearest the main entrance to the nave is partially covered by the balcony. Only about 2/7 of the window is visible below the balcony and about the same space including the stone tracery above the balcony. This will have to have a special treatment, so keep this in mind as we develop the typical design for the group, so that the parts which do show will be in harmony with the others.

The Crucifixion Window

Christ is represented on the Cross with His Blessed Mother Mary and Saint John the beloved disciple at either side. The open book below is inscribed with the text, - "Father forgive them for they know not what they do."

This window is designed in the scheme having ruby as the background color of the medallions, and much of the field, in contrast with the plan having blue in these positions.

*Important, re vent: Marlowe writes, Oct. 1960 "...too much to cut off. Exact vent size $25 \frac{3}{8} \times 28 \frac{1}{4}$. It has a $\frac{1}{8}$ " reveal all around..." Note given to glaziers.
