To be devoted to The Cycle of Life and the Function of the Chapel  
by incidents in the Life of Our Lord, introducing the Creation of Man  
in the small square at the base of the central group; then the Nativity at  
the left; the Baptism of Christ at the right; the young Christ in the Temple  
above the Creation in the center; Christ Blessing Children in the next left  
panel; balanced by the Family in the home at Nazareth, - the young Christ  
helping Joseph with the little insert of Mary spinning; then the Wedding  
Feast at Cana in the upper left, the Last Supper in the upper right (to  
emphasize the Eucharistic theme of the altar); the Crucifixion at the center;  
and the Resurrection in the upper square.

1/2 inch rebate on all sections except the casements. The two lowest panels  
in the side panels are wood casements - set with putty from the outside. All  
the rest have wood stops set from outside.

The Annunciation in place of the Creation, and the Good Shepherd in the center.

As planned, it is devoted to the Life Cycle as exemplified in that of Our Lord with emphasis on the functions of the Chapel.

The theme begins with the central base panel representing the Annunciation and continues with the Nativity of Our Lord at the left; His Baptism by St. John the Baptist at the right; the young Christ in the Temple disputing with the Doctors at the center; (The Blessed Virgin and Saint Joseph returning to find Him are represented in the little figures opposite the temple candlestick); the Family in the home at Nazareth (left); Christ Blessing little Children (right); the miracle at the Wedding Feast at Cana (upper left); the Last Supper (upper right); and Christ the Good Shepherd in the dominant position in the central panel. Then His Triumphant Resurrection.
