General Information To be installed in the frame with the present casements removed. At present this is a double casement window. Geometric and foliated pattern, in keeping with the other windows of the Church, with the symbol of the cross.

Mr. Widman writes: "We believe that light colors would be preferable as the only daylight comes from the light court."

In view of its subdued illumination, we have kept it luminous and brilliant to make the most of the light it receives and to avoid darkening the passage.

It seems appropriate to introduce the Cross as the dominant symbol, with four white fleur-de-lys of Purity that may be said to suggest the four Evangelists, thus symbolizing Our Lord and the Gospel Writers.

The central foliated pattern flowers in red roses, symbol of divine love; and stars through the blue border suggest heavenly steadfastness.
