This window carries right down on the outside, but is cut by the balcony on the inside.

\*\* or we might depart somewhat from the general plan in the lower part as it occurs in the narthex, further enriching the panels with more definite symbols of Christian Service and Worship, at a cost of <sup>75</sup>~~\$945~~.

The window cut by the balcony could be made complete in the pattern suggested in the upper part for one thousand, six hundred fifty dollars. It could be divided into two materials, allowing eight hundred twenty-five dollars for the upper part, and the same amount for the lower part. Or, it would be pleasant to depart somewhat from the general plan in the lower part as it occurs in the market, further enriching the panels with Christian symbols as suggested in the sketch for one thousand twenty dollars, - the seven branched candlestick of the Temple symbolizing the Old Testament, and the Cross and triangle of the Trinity for the New Testament. This entire window should be done at one time, as it carries down on the outside, and it would be unwise to join it sections separately.
