General Information

This window to be devoted to Saint Peter with related incidents.
This window goes next to the Saint Luke window - see photograph.
Also see photograph of the Saint John Evangelist window on north side.
This design to be carried out in the exact same manner as the earlier ones.

Note that this window and the one on the other side of the Saint Luke window will have the red border and background scheme - with the blue-winged cherubim, - like the Saint John window on the other side - see sketch of this.

Donor, Mrs. Nonnenmacher wants to come to see window in process. Be sure to let her know.

Saint Peter holds his traditional keys, while the principal medallion represents him (and Saint Andrew) being called to be fishers of men.

Pentecost is symbolized in the smaller base medallion; with Saint Peter healing the lame man, (Acts 3:1-8) in the smaller, intermediate medallion.

At the top, the Angel visits Saint Peter in prison.

Blue-winged cherubim
~~Seraphim~~ accent the foliated pattern through the field, and the border is enriched with stars of heavenly steadfastness and flaming roses of Divine Love.
