General Information See photographs and designs for windows being made. Mr. Willis says these ought to be kept small in scale to go with the first one, although he agreed that we could simplify the borders (see Slide of the first window by Lamb). Our windows to be kept light and sparkling to let in more light.

This window #4 is devoted to EPIPHANY - 5-pointed star.

Left: Paul traveling (by boat); right: Wise Men coming - star; small scene: Flight into Egypt.

BLUE window.

Window #4, fourth from transept, Epistle side, is also predominantly blue. Its heading is the Epiphany, with the Star of Bethlehem in the upper tracery member casting down its rays toward the approaching Wise Men grouped in the upper part of the right panel.

Below is the Flight into Egypt, with Joseph leading the donkey bearing the Blessed Virgin and the Christ Child.

Saint Paul's missionary journeys are symbolized in the opposite panel with the rough sea suggesting the great storm encountered on his last voyage to Rome. Smaller stars of heavenly steadfastness enrich the borders.
