General Information Central figure of Our Lord holding a reproduction of  
Saint Chrysostom's Church (see photograph of church he sent), and on a  
scroll the text "The spirit and the bride say come".

In the top center we desire a reproduction of the Badge of the R.C.M.P.-  
see this;

On the right hand side the flag of the Anglican Church of Canada. - See  
this.

On the left hand side the flag of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the  
U.S.A.

At the base, the memorial inscription: "To the Glory of God and in ever loving memory of Alfred Wallace  
Edith Rogers Owen and Alfred Wallace Owen. See above."

Note: We are going to remove the heavy metal casement in this window.

We have completed our study of the design for the north vestibule window, and are sending you the rough color sketch herewith.

As planned, the dominant central figure of Our Lord holds a model of Saint Chrysostom's Church.

(Be sure the Ch. is a fair image of the front of the Ch. (See pencil sketch and photo.).

In the field at either side is the text, "The spirit and the bride may come"; and below are the crossed flags of the Anglican Church of Canada and our own Protestant Episcopal Church flag.


(Be sure the staff of the American Ch. Flag is on top of the Canadian Ch. Flag.)

In the head of the panel is the badge of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, and across the base is the memorial inscription ("Edith Rogers Owen and Alfred Wallace Owen.")
