General Information **The pastor thinks all the windows should be kept light with colorful figures and symbols, and only a little foliated patterning on geometric backgrounds. The figures and symbols to be in irregular shapes, not formal set medallions - idea something like Miami Beach.**

This to be something like the Baptistry window in Saint Raphael's Church, New Orleans, but not quite so stiff lines, but a very light field.

** Then there is the color sketch for the Baptistry window, with Saint John baptizing Our Lord, and the * shell and Chi Rho below.*

** We are to make a new design with the theme "Presentation of Christ in the Temple"*

We have restudied the design for your small Chapel window in the theme of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple and are sending you the rough sketch, herewith.

The ancient Simeon holds the Christ Child in his arms. Above are the Temple candles, and below, the gift of Doves.

Space is hardly available to include the Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph, although if you wish, they could be designed as very small figures in the light field at either side.

This will make a very lovely window and we are eager to develop it in the color and light of the actual glass. The cost is the same as for the Baptism window, - five hundred dollars.
