As planned, it is devoted to the Parable of the Sower. At the left the Sower spreads his seed, and at the right, he reaps the abundant harvest from the seed that fell on good ground.

The stony places having little earth and the thorns that sprung up and choked the seed are symbolised in the medallions below.

The life-giving sun is symbolised in the quatrefoil above with birds on the wing.

All are set in decorative architectural "canopy" that might be said to suggest heavenly mansions, our reward for good works.

Figures about 39 inches high.
