See photographs and designs for windows being made. Mr. Willis says these ought to be kept small in scale to go with the first one, although he agreed that we could simplify the borders (see slide of the first window by Lamb). Our windows to be kept light and sparkling to let in more light.

The next design, in the cooler palette, is the Crucifixion window, - second from the entrance on the Gospel side. The cross is designed in the tracery member, encircled by the crown of thorns.

Saint Paul is represented in prison in the right panel, writing with pen and scroll. Chains are at his feet, and his guard with spear is near by. Opposite is the Crucifixion of Our Lord, with the other two crosses, the veiled sun, and implications of disturbances of nature. Below, Our Lord kneels in prayer at Gethsemane. Through the borders are roses of Divine love.
