General Information The present glass is a light gray-green, hammered Cathedral. The walls are cream, the wood light, and there are light greenish touches here and there in the decoration. It would be a good idea to keep considerably light green in the fields, as the windows will probably be developed over a long period.


A geometric background, something in the nature of the big Pittsfield windows - Saint Charles Church, would be good, for they have a similar pattern in wood grilles either side of the chancel.

We should study subjects from the Life of Christ, and make suggestions. Also send subject-plans of other churches, as we did for Hamilton.

*The windows are arranged as in the little diagram, some triple and some double - 23 above and 7 below, all the same size.

Then there is the big window opposite the chancel where they have big slabs of rather pure color in a variety - red, blue, green, gold, etc.

As planned, we have represented three early incidents in the life story of Our Lord,- the Annunciation, the Nativity, and the Presentation in the Temple. Although only two of these would probably come in the first windows which are a pair, we are suggesting a group of three as the majority of the windows are in groups of that number.

We have suggested the background in somewhat the same spirit as the paneling at either side of your chancel, that is a composition of rather free rectangular forms. We have in mind using about the same background color as you have at present, but in a variety of tones and with added contrasting notes. This will soften the impact of the new windows as they are developed over a length of time, so that the over-all harmony will not be destroyed.
