General Information **This is to be the simpler type, with only the figure
of Saint Jude in the center panel, one medallion in each side
panel, and symbols below.**

(See photostat of sketch made for the St. Matthew window).

The window opposite, on the ^{south} ~~north~~ represents Saint Jude who holds one of his traditional symbols, the ship of his missionary journeys. Below is the flaming rose of Love or Mercy, - "Mercy unto you, and Peace and Love, be multiplied" (from the Epistle of St. Jude).

The medallion at the left represents the legend of his conversion of the King of Babylon, while at the right, Our Lord promises Saint Jude that the Holy Ghost will sustain them after His Ascension (St. John 14-22:26). Below are other symbols of Saint Jude, - the ear and boat hook; as well as symbols of his martyrdom, - the post and arrows; while at the top is the Dove and the broken sword of Peace and Mercy, with the book of his Epistle.

IMPORTANT: OMIT THE NAME OF SAINT JUDE FROM THE BOOK AT THE TOP. ✓

Names of the figures do not appear in any of the windows.

Perhaps use a different symbol - see letter of 10/15/63

Keep in mind that this window was originally planned for the North side. It is now to be on the south side.
