This shorter panel is a companion to The Resurrection panel, Christ, the Tomb and Mary Magdalene.

have also made a rough color sketch for the remaining short window devoted to the Supper at Emmaus.

Our Lord is seated at table with His two companions of the road at the moment when His true identity is revealed to them, the lamp above suggests the interior setting.

Above is the Heavenly crown, and below,- the flame of Divine Zeal.

IMPORTANT CHANGE: Our Lord to be robed in white, with His companions in blue and purple or violet tones. To be carried out in approximately the same colors as the others to complete the harmony, but tone down the bright reds and blues just a bit.

Make change in design, to be returned to donor for approval -

Figure of Christ to be robed in white.

Center figure to remain as it is, in violet,

The right figure to be changed from green to blue.

The tablecloth a pale yellow.

Later message: Have the violet robe on the right ~~fig~~ figure, and the blue robe on the center figure. Donor likes the Christ robe in "white and light green" as is.
