Blueprints

General Information One lancet to depict John the Baptist baptizing Jesus in the River Jordan, and the other, Jesus interviewing Nicodemus.

Beneath Jesus and Nicodemus, use the words from S. John 3:7, "Ye must be born again".

Beneath John the Baptist and Jesus, use the words from S. Matthew 3:17, "My beloved Son".

In the tracery member, use the Descending Dove.

In the medallions below: below the Baptism, use symbols of John the Baptist.

In the medallion in the other lancet, symbols of Jesus.

This window to be in the same plan as the Uhrig window in place.

The pastor writes: "I would suggest that since ruby is the predominant color in the Brown-Tomlinson and Uhrig windows, that Blue predominate in the Baptistry window."

"...As planned, one lancet is devoted to the Baptism of Jesus by Saint John the Baptist, and the other to Our Lord and Nicodemus.

In the first, Jesus stands in the Jordan, while Saint John holds the fustic crossed staff and shell of Baptism. Below is the text from Saint Matthew 3:17, - "My beloved Son".

The lantern suggests that Nicodemus came to Jesus by night. The text reads, - "Ye must be born again", from the Gospel of Saint John 3:7.

Kneeling Angels above and below the Baptism again hold the symbolid shell, the beehive suggesting Saint John's nourishment in the wilderness, and the scroll inscribed, "Ecce Agnus Dei". Angels accompanying Christ and Nicodemus bear the Chi Rho monogram of Our Lord, the Fountain of Eternal Life and the Cross of Faith. The Descending Dove of the Holy Spirit is designed in the tracery above.

At the base is the memorial inscription, - "To the Glory of God and in loving memory of all Christians heretofore unremembered".

Blue is the predominant color, though well foiled with silver and gold on fields of deep ruby. ..."
