General Information Christ high at center, with Nativity medallion below;
prophets - Hosea, Jeremiah, Isaiah, Amos - low, with simple significant subject
incident from their prophecy above Amos? shepherd. Mrs. Bean likes staff,
as in Sheridan chancel.

Colors comparatively light and brilliant. Blues lighter than in aisle
windows.

Blue fields, red borders, purples, green, gold and white.

Twelve lambs in tracery, with symbols of Christ, etc.

Photograph sketch in color slide to show the congregation.

This window is devoted to Our Lord and His "spiritual ancestors" and "descendants" - Old Testament leaders, the Prophets who foretold His coming, and the Apostles who disseminated His Word.

Our Lord holds the dominant position at the center, robed in white and gold, traditional color symbols of purity and heavenly treasures. Accents of ruby stand for divine love in the ancient color symbolism.

The medallion below is devoted to His nativity. The Holy Child rests in the manger, attended by His mother Mary, and Saint Joseph.

At the left is Jeremiah, with the scroll inscribed with the citation of his prophecy, Jeremiah 33:15.

In the opposite position, Isaiah also bears the prophetic scroll with the citation, Isaiah 7:14, - "Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son..." He holds tongs and coal of fire with which the angel purified his lips.

The first lancet at the left is devoted to Hosea, with the text: "For I desired mercy, and not sacrifice" (Hosea 6:6). ~~Or, the reference might well be to his prophecy of the resurrection (HOSEA 6:2).~~

At the extreme right is Amos, the Shepherd. In the field is the reference to his prophecy of the crucifixion and attending convulsions of nature.

Medallions above the Prophets are devoted to Old Testament leaders in their younger aspects. Moses is first at the left, kneeling before the Burning Bush. Next is Daniel in the Lion's Den; third, young Samuel rises from his bed upon hearing God's call; and finally, David the youth, playing before King Saul. These medallions will be a little larger in the actual window; about the same size as the Nativity medallion below Our Lord.

In the tracery above Our Lord are the symbolic Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end; and at the top, His familiar monograms, the IHC and Chi Rho.

Twelve sheep are designed in other tracery members, symbolizing the Twelve Apostles going out into the world to preach the Gospel,
