~~The figure of the Blessed Virgin Mary harmonizes with Saint John the Evangelist (in place). She is represented in blue, holding the symbol of the lily of purity. Her usual crowned monogram is indicated in the border. The border is designed in a manner similar to the other windows.~~

..... This is to be a companion to the Saint John panel in place, and is to have the figure of Saint Joseph, in a blue garment.

..... Also, include the symbol of the American Legion, as in the companion window. Also include the lily to balance Saint John's eagle.

BE SURE TO MAKE AN EXTRA 5 x 7 Kodachrome for Mrs. Tucker, as she lives in Binghamton, New York and will not see the window very often.

Give this to her.

As planned, it is devoted to Saint Joseph robed in blue and holding the symbol of the carpenter's square.

The American Legion symbol is very roughly indicated in the border at the lower left, and Saint Joseph's lily symbol recalling his flowering staff, is shown in the field above.

The border is designed to harmonize with the companion window and will be carried out in similar manner.

The memorial inscription is indicated across the base,- "In Memory of Arnold R. Tucker, Sr."
