General Information *3 panels wide and 4 high, double-hung.*

Represent John Eliot preaching to the Indians, - central section, just above the rail - the old Church, of which she will send us a photograph. The Ship of the Church with the cross sail, the pomegranate for the unity and fruitfulness of the Church, and the phoenix, with some inscription, the text of which they will get to us.

Use almost clear glasses, - just off-whites. Color only in the Eliot panel, and touches of gold stain on the others. or clear window

glass if they prefer. 1/25/57

This window is designed to commemorate the rebirth of the Church and the fellowships renewed and strengthened by the fire.

The central panel represents John Eliot Preaching to the Indians, recalling the great window devoted to this same theme in the earlier Church.

Smaller inserts suggest this earlier Church, - the traditional symbol of the Ship of the Church, with its sail inscribed with the cross, the open Bible, the lamp of enlightenment and learning, the pomegranate, symbolizing the unity and fruitfulness of the Church, and the phoenix rising anew from the flames of its nest.

A space is provided at the center for the dedicatory text.
