General Information Earlier windows shipped by Hunnewell Trucking Co. Inc.

To be devoted to symbols of The Trinity.

To have symbols of the "All-Seeing Eye", the "Agnus Dei and Book of
Seven Seals", and "The Seven-Fold Flame or The Dove". The symbol for the
Father pught to be in the top opening, the Agnus Dei in the lower left
opening, and the Holy Spirit to the lower right opening.

As planned, it is decided to symbols of the Trinity - the All-Seeing Eye of the Father in the Triangle at the top; the Agnus Dei and Book of Seven Seals at the left; and the Descending Dove of the Holy Spirit at the right.

"The Committee has studied the sketch and feels that it is too great a departure from the general theme of the windows in the nave of the church. They would prefer to have the red or blue borders of conventional cloud forms and stars and some use of the foliated fields of growing vine forms. The general design of the All-Seeing Eye, Agnus Dei, and Holy Spirit are quite good and might well remain in the window.

"It is our intention in these new windows to eliminate the cusps. Therefore, new sash for these windows will not be too expensive. Perhaps you will want to make this change in your new sketch of the window."

We have made a new sketch for the eastern window over the side entrance in character with your other windows, and are sending it to you herewith.

The Book of Seven Seals is not included with the Agnus Dei, as we felt the space was too limited and it would become over complicated. This is the way the symbol is generally represented, with the banner of victory. However, if you wish, we will, of course, include the book and seals.
