General Information This is to be the elaborate medallion type -

To be devoted to Easter -

~~Upper left~~ Resurrected Christ, with sleeping soldiers. Upper right
~~Lower left~~ 3 Marys and Angel at Tomb. Lower right

~~Upper right~~ Christ's Appearance to Mary Magdalene. Upper left
~~Lower right~~ Supper at Emmaus. Lower left

Rector writes: "I would particularly like to have this window emphasized by golds and yellows."

Resurrection panel only at this time (The right-hand panel)

The neighboring window toward the entrance symbolizes Easter, with the Resurrection of Our Lord and His subsequent appearances.

The radiant figure of Christ, risen from the dark tomb, bearing the cruciform banner of victory, is represented in the upper left medallion. At His feet are the sleeping soldiers.

Opposite, Christ appears to Mary Magdalene in the Garden. (Angels at head and foot, where the body of Jesus had lain).

Below are the Three Marys with the Angel at the empty tomb, and the Sapper at Emmaus, at the moment of recognition.

In the fields are the pomegranate, symbol of the resurrection and immortality; the lily of purity; and at the base, the Phoenix rising anew from the flames of its nest, traditional emblem of the Resurrection, and the Peacock, of Immortality. Near by is the Anchor Cross of Faith and Hope.

The golds and yellows are emphasized in this window.

I am afraid we have the panels of these west windows out of chronological order but they can easily be reversed, also reversing the medallion of Christ in Gethsemane to face in.
