General Information

We followed your plan quite closely, devoting the west window to the Old Testament, with the Creation of Man (and animals), the Fall, and Noah and his ark across the bottom; Abraham and Isaac (the Hand of God staying the knife, and the ram in the thicket); Jacob's ladder; Joseph revealing his brothers in Egypt (fills their sacks with corn); the Exodus at the Red Sea; Judges (Gideon with the fleece; the song of Deborah and Samson with the jaw bone); King David, the Psalmist, overshadowing his son Solomon and his wife Daniel (walking in the statues of David, his father); Daniel in the Den of Lions (God's Angel protects Daniel); Aaron, the High Priest, and the Tabernacle (four figures present their offerings); and in the head of the central lancet, Moses, the Lawgiver. In the tracery members at either side are the Trumpets of the Lord.
