General Information

We have been studying the design of your side windows and have prepared rough color sketches to illustrate our thoughts.

A typical group of four is devoted to the Apostles, - Saint Andrew with his diagonal Cross; Saint Philip, the traditional basket of leaves recalling his remark when Our Lord fed the multitude; Saint Bartholomew, the fig and scimitar, and Saint Thomas, with carpenter's square and spear.

They could be continued with other apostles, completing the group started in the chancel window and going on with symbols of many other saintly personages of Biblical and later times; or they could go back to the Prophets and Patriarchs.

Another suggestion would be to devote them to related Christian symbols, including the Cardinal and Theological Virtues, the Acts of Mercy, and the Beatitudes.

We have devoted the two end windows to Saints Peter and Paul, each with their traditional symbols, - Saint Peter's Keys and the Church; and Paul with the Sword of his martyrdom which is also the Sword of the Spirit, and the Book inscribed with the traditional Three Fountains.

All are kept brilliant for adequate illumination, but with an abundance of pure, rich color.

We believe the smaller windows can be undertaken at a cost of eight hundred and forty dollars for a group of four. This would make only two hundred and ten dollars for individual panels, affording inexpensive memorials.

The two figure windows can be made for twelve hundred dollars, or six hundred dollars each.

These are all on the basis of doing several at the same time, reducing the installation costs.
