General Information Restore burned windows as follows:

Window #1 - nearest entrance on north side (Transfiguration). IMPORTANT NOTE: THIS IS TO HAVE A NEW FORM OF INSCRIPTION: AS FOLLOWS: "In loving memory of Maria Prentice, 1952" - see above.

This three-lancet traceried window with the central lancet badly damaged, the lower part completely destroyed, the side lancets have a number of fire cracks in the pieces of glass, the leading is damaged, and the waterproofing of the window has oozed out. The damage to this window as appraised by Mr. Willet, including removing the window, packing it and shipping it, and replacing it, was \$2,000. Mr. Willet has advised... it would cost \$750 to remove this window, pack it and ship it to you in Boston, and to put the window back in place upon its return from Boston. This would leave \$1,250 to be paid to you for putting the window back in its original condition."

Window #5 - nearest entrance on south side (Entry into Jerusalem)... "This... window has been weakened by the heat, some fire breaks, and the waterproofing has run out. Mr. Willet estimated that it would cost \$1,500 to remove, repair and replace. He advised us today that it would cost \$750 to remove the window, pack it and ship it to you in Boston, and to replace it upon its...

return from Boston. This would leave \$750 to be paid to you to put the window back in its original condition. "
