Dr. Campbell says: "One thing to keep in mind is the Chapel is a little dark, which means that the colors should not be too deep."

theme of Baptism.

The dominant medallion represents the Baptism of Our Lord. He stands in the Jordan with Saint John the Baptist on the shore beside Him carrying the crossed staff. Above is the descending Dove of the Holy Spirit, and in the secondary medallion, below, a symbol of the baptismal font.

Shell and water motifs accent the border designed in decorative architectural forms. A somewhat similar arrangement in the other windows would feature symbols of the Sacraments in much the same manner.

The colorful medallions and borders provide a rich, full color character, while the light foliated fields insure an abundance of illumination.
