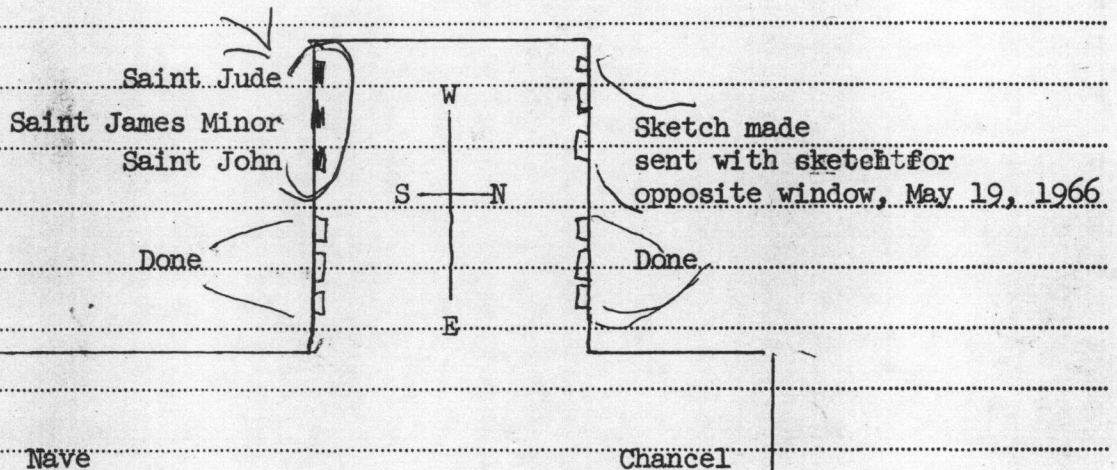

General Information Sts. John, James Minor, Jude

St. John, the beloved disciple, kneels with the chalice and serpent, recalling the legend of the poisoned cup from which he drank unharmed.

St. James Minor stands on the top of a tower. Legend has it that one attempt on his life was in pushing him from such a position. The saw suggests his final martyrdom.

St. Jude's boat with the crossed mast implies his missionary journeys.

We have received your current set of color sketches for the John, James and Jude set of windows. We have compared them with the initial set of sketches which you prepared prior to Father Vall's departure last fall.

The James and Jude figures in this latest set come through in a stronger manner, and we would prefer that you use them. In the case of the figure of John, however, the placement of the hands in the initial set comes through in a stronger way, so we are returning his cartoon as you had prepared it last September.
