"Baptism" "Last Supper" ("Sermon on the Mount") ("Christ Blessing Children")

Contract for 2 Aisle windows has come

"Baptism" and "Last Supper"

These windows are designed to symbolize the Sacraments and Blessings of Our Lord and His Church.

The first celebrates Baptism through the baptism of Christ by Saint John the Baptist. Our Lord stands at the Jordan in descending rays of Divine light, with Saint John holding the shell of Baptism at one side and an attendant angel at the other. Above is the dove of the Holy Spirit.

Lower symbols are the Fountain of Life and the Baptismal Font.

The lower central medallion represents Samuel of the Old Testament anointing the young David, - the ancient type of blessing or baptism.

The second window is devoted to the Last Supper, with Our Lord at the center, holding the Bread and Wine. With Him are Saint John and Saint Peter while the remaining apostles are grouped at either side.

Below are symbols of wheat and grapes, and the young Christ in the temple with the Doctors in the central medallion, symbolizing the promise of our Lord's ministry.

The next window would be devoted to The Sermon on the Mount, with the blind and paralytic in the medallion, commemorating the fulfillment of Christ's teaching and healing mission.

The final window on the west side would represent Christ Blessing Little Children, and in the home of his Friends of Bethany, Mary and Martha, suggesting His intimate human relations and personal aspects of His blessings.
