Dr. Canon likes the chancel window, and is not entirely pleased with the flatness of the first two aisle windows.

There are three suggestions for the side windows, two in leaded glass, and one for the thick French glass set in spray railing - although any of the three could be developed in either method.

One symbolizes the Fountain of Salvation, with the Rivers of Life and symbols of Baptism. The design suggest the Disciples drinking from Living Waters. At the top is the Lamb of God, the Light of the World.

Another is devoted to the Tree of Life, as described in the Revelation of Saint John. It bears the Twelve Fruits, suggested in pomegranates. The cross introduces the second Tree of Life. At the top is the Bright and Morning Star.

The third is an abstraction, again suggesting the Fountain of Life.

I think these side windows can be made for about twenty-eight hundred dollars each in any of these designs, and in either method. We visualize best effectively they will develop in the color and light of the actual glass, and we are eager to undertake the way of them.
