See window we are now making for the west side, and slides of windows in place. This window will go next to the Burnham window in place. There are several by Hardman, some by Tiffany, one by Lamb, and a couple not identified. Present windows are very deep, and perhaps this one should not go too light. Keep field fairly simple.

We have been studying the design for the window, devoting it to the Nativity of Our Lord, and have prepared a rough color sketch to show you what we have in mind.

The Blessed Mother kneels before the Christ Child in the manger, while Saint Joseph stands near Him. The traditional ox and ass are represented near by, and the Star of Bethlehem above sheds its rays of Divine Light on those below.

The decorative border and foliated field are designed in harmony with the window we are developing opposite, but as that has the oak motif, this flowers in the white fleur-de-lys of Purity.
