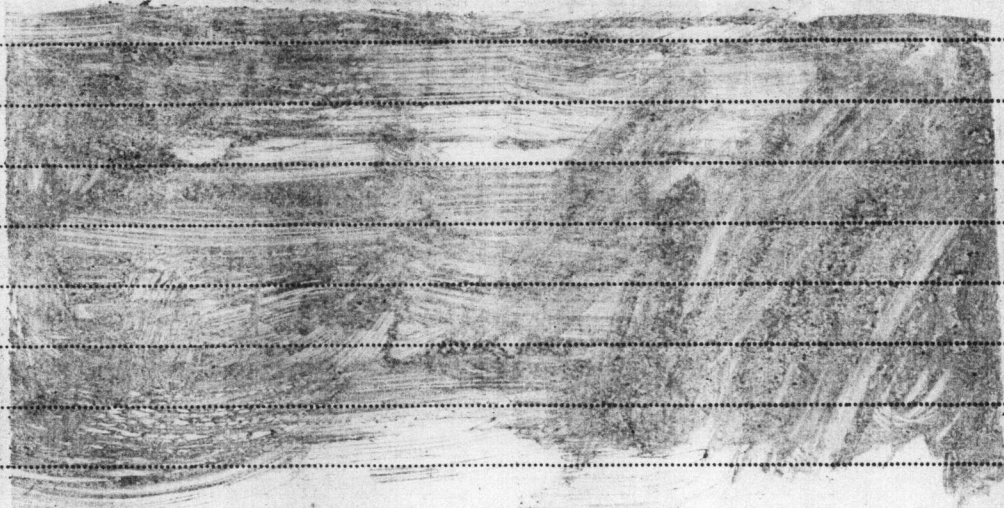

We have completed our study of the design for your window in the North Brewer-Eddington Methodist Church and are sending you the rough color sketch, herewith.

It follows the general character of the figure of Our Lord that you liked in Northminster Presbyterian Church, Evanston, Illinois. In actual design it can more closely conform to that figure, if you wish, but we have composed it to balance and harmonize with the opposite one in your church. In any case the actual detail will be as rich and as carefully executed as shown in the photographs I left with you. Colors are counterchanged for variety, and it will take its place to excellent purpose in the color and light of the actual glass.

Our Lord stands in an attitude of welcome, robed in blue and gold, symbols of heavenly contemplation and promise. Traditionally, the ruby field is the color symbol of Divine Love.

A space at the base is provided for the memorial inscription, which I believe was with the sheet of dimensions I left with you.

I think it would be best to have a local carpenter-contractor make the new sash, fitted to the opening and sent to us for installation of the glass. Do you know of someone there who can do this to advantage? Some years ago, we had dealings with Owen Gray and Son, 9 Wilson Street, Brewer. I wonder if they are still there? We also have dealt with Perry & Morrill in Bangor, but I cannot find their address. We will greatly appreciate your help.
