General Information

Mr. Skinner sent samples of glass that will be used in the windows on  
March 26, 1969.

The one for the side group is a development of the rough pencil sketch you have. With the Mysteries as our motif, the medallions symbolize the Annunciation (lily), the Visitation (rose) and the Nativity (star).

In similar manner, the offering of doves (lower tier on separate card) symbolize the Presentation in the Temple, the candle suggests finding the Christ Child in the Temple, and the chalice, - the Agony in the Garden.

The scourges ( top line) of course represent the Scourging; the Crown of Thorns for the crowning; and the Cross for bearing the Cross.

The legend of the pelican feeding its young with its life blood is the ancient symbol of the Crucifixion; the Lamb of God with the banner of victory stands for the Resurrection, and the eagle (bird that soars highest) the Ascension.

The descending Dove of the Holy Spirit symbolizes Pentecost; the ancient monogram, winged, - the Ascension of the Blessed Virgin Mary; and the crowned monogram, Her Coronation. This group might well be left to the last for the side chancel window.

We have also prepared a sketch for the large window, devoting it largely to Saint Andrew. He is represented with the net and oar of his occupation. At either side are his traditional symbols, the fishes, again recalling his occupation and his calling to be a fisher of men; and the diagonal cross of his martyrdom.

Below are symbols related to Baptism. The font with wavy lines suggesting water, the shell of Baptism, and the descending Dove of the Holy Spirit.

We believe we can undertake the side windows, as designed, at the cost we had suggested, - four hundred and eighty dollars for each group of three, installed in the frames provided for them by the Church.

We find we can make the large triple group for considerably less than I had thought, - fifteen hundred and sixty dollars, on the same terms as for the aisle groups.
