General Information..... CHRIST THE KING AND THE APOCALYPTIC THEME.

Our Lord is balanced by the radiant figure of the Bride, - New Jerusalem, coming down from Heaven, partially veiled in clouds. "Behold, the Tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them."

Below, the figure of the old man comforting the child in rays of Divine light suggests the passage, "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes and there shall be no more death."

The kneeling young man with the sword symbolizes crusading youth, - "He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son."

Heavenly crowns enrich the fields.

In the central tracery member, we have indicated the upper symbol of your Church seal, - the Greek cross and monogram, "Jesus Christ, the Victor."

Although the lancets are a little shorter, the tracery makes up for it and the window involves as much as the others. We feel it is a wonderful introduction to your service of worship.
