





Minutes of Meetings of Conf. & Comm<sup>y</sup>  
of Institute.

Nov. 20. 1877. Corporation. present 18 members.

The Old list of Officers - re-elected for the ensuing year.

The Comm: & the School asked further time for reporting on the Subject of reducing expenses &c. After some discussion, & remarks at some length by W. B. P., on the importance of maintaining, if possible the present scope of the School, ~~and~~ <sup>by securing</sup> ~~in addition~~ <sup>in addition</sup> to the permanent fund, and after this view had been earnestly sustained by Messrs H. B. Rogers, Redden & Little, - it was voted to make application to the Legislature for a grant to the Inst. of \$50,000 on condition that the Corporation should contribute an equal amount. A Committee was then appointed to carry out this purpose - consisting of  
W. B. P.: N. B. R.: E. D. Atkinson -  
E. S. Philbrick, J. D. Runkle, J. Little  
- Redden.

Dec. 4. - 3 1/2 P.M. Com: on School.

Atkinson. Bourne - Cabot - E. S. Phillips  
Runkle & W. B. R.

W. B. R. - was appointed Chairman for  
the Year.

Voted that hereafter four members shall  
make a Quorum, and that the Com: shall  
hold stated meetings twice a month during  
the session of the school, viz on the 2<sup>nd</sup>  
& 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday at 3 1/2 P.M. -  
at the Institute.

Voted that the ~~subject~~ <sup>report</sup> ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> a letter  
the preceding meeting of the Com:  
be not reported to the Corp<sup>n</sup> and that  
the subjects to which ~~it~~ refers, be  
further considered & reported on  
by a sub-committee consisting of  
W. B. R. Runkle & Bourne, ~~to~~  
confer with such members of  
the Faculty as are immediately  
interested.

Resolved to hold the next stated meeting on  
the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of Dec.

Jan. 8. As the 4<sup>th</sup> <sup>10<sup>th</sup></sup> Tuesday of Dec. (4)  
fell on a Y<sup>e</sup> M<sup>o</sup> day, the regular  
meeting of the Com: on the School was  
omitted. The meeting today consisted  
W. B. R. J. D. H. J. S. Phillips &  
Ed. Atkinson.

The only business of the Com: was  
a vote to recommend to the Corp<sup>n</sup> -  
Whitson Prof. Ward's claims for  
dues for money advanced by him  
to his class last year referred to him  
by the Inst<sup>n</sup>.

There was much conversation about  
the choice ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> a meeting  
the Legislature to present our Memorial,  
& it was agreed that I should first  
apply to Mr. Frook. G. Bird - a Justice,  
to Mr. Washburn of Worcester -  
Mr. Speaker Long, <sup>Long</sup> this morning, named  
both of these gentlemen to me.

Jan. 7 Meeting of Comm. on Mem. to Legis.  
3 1/2 P.M. Present - H. B. Rogers, J. S. Rankin  
E. Atkinson, J. L. Little, H. P. Kiddle &  
W. B. R.

The Memorial prepared by me, & of which  
100 Copies had been sent to the Members - was  
agreed to be signed by those present, Mr Atkinson  
adding the Name of E. S. Phelps, Mr. Nelson  
authorized me to add the Name of G. B.  
Emerson & others.

The following Names were added  
to the Memorial & Subscribed as part  
of the Comm. on the proposed  
Memorial - to be presented to the Legis.

G. B. Emerson - E. R. Mudge  
John Cummings, J. C. Rowley, M. D. Ross -  
thus increasing the Comm. to twelve.

Jan. 8. Called on Sheaker Long, who suggested  
Mr. Frank Bird as a desirable person to present  
the Memorial, & also spoke of Wade of  
Newtown & J. D. Washburn of Worcester  
the same Connection of <sup>the</sup> Society Mr. Bird  
at State House, who agreed to take care  
of the Memorial - of left at the Finance Com.  
Room. 11<sup>th</sup>. Left Memorial with note  
to Mr. B. on table of Finance Com. at  
1.40 P.M.

The Memorial was presented the  
same afternoon - I suffered by Mr. B. &  
was referred as I requested to the Comm.  
on Education.

Jan. 13. Good Notices have appeared in  
yesterday's Advertiser, under the head of  
Legislative proceedings, - & several  
References to it, with a Censure & partial  
Abstract in the Sunday Herald - Today.

Jan. 16. Meeting of Memorial Comm: at 3<sup>1/2</sup> PM  
Present - W. B. R. - J. S. R. - H. B. R. - E. S. P. -  
G. B. E. - H. P. R. + H.

Mr. Robt. called attention to an error of Statist  
in the last sentence of the Memorial - where he says  
that the Inst. has not hitherto rec<sup>d</sup> any direct  
pecuniary Aid from the State, & satisfied the  
Comm: that the Last Grant of the Legislature  
of \$50,000. to supplement the early Congrega-  
tional Land grant was made directly from the Treasury  
of the State.

It was voted to correct the Mem: so  
as to correspond with the facts - & that  
Pres<sup>t</sup>. Richards have Copies of the  
Comm: Mem. struck off immediately  
one of which he should be should give to  
the Comm: of the Legis: tomorrow in lieu  
of the former - & that he should distribute  
the corrected Mem: to the various Corporations.

The Members of the Comm: took Memoranda  
of the names of the Legis: Comm: on Finance  
& Education - with the understanding that each  
was to seek opportunities for interests there in  
the application of the Institute,

Jan. 22 - At the hearing before the  
Comm. on Education held at Wash  
today - were present Prof. Saunders  
& White of the Senate & Prof. Hale &  
Brooklet, Peck etc of House - & of the  
Memorial Comm: ~~the~~ attended - Prof.  
Mudge - Hendley - Hadden - Rankin -  
Cummings & H. B. Rogers. & W. B. P.  
The last named opened the hearing by  
an address on the History Character &  
social work of the Inst. ~~speaking about~~  
~~the~~ - & was followed by - Prof. Mudge  
Hendley - Rankin - & Prof. Rankin.  
The ~~Comm.~~ in Education <sup>at a great</sup> ~~will~~ visit  
the Institute, when work for the 2<sup>d</sup> time  
is resumed, & will probably finish in  
a 2<sup>d</sup> hearing - As far as we could  
infer, we think the Comm. favors  
to our application -

Jan. 22: 3 1/2 P.M. The United  
Meeting of Comm. School  
Only 3 present - Bowen Rankin  
& W. B. P. - left them to go on  
Nothing was done - I believe it was

thought best for the Comm. to defer  
action on the report of the way as yet.  
until we can have a response  
from the Legislature -

W B P left with the Educ  
Comm: the 2 bound volumes of  
Annual Catalogues & Reports -  
also the two later Reports of  
May 1875 - 6.

Jan. 24. By request, I met the Socy of  
Alumni at the Club of their Dinner at  
Youngs Hotel - present about 50 members,  
& made a short address - calling their  
attention to our pending appeal to the  
Legislature & asking them to give their  
influence in its behalf by personal  
communication with the Members of the  
Legis for their districts, & send other  
ways as they thought likely to be useful.  
Before adjourning they appointed a  
Comm: to attend to the subject -

Since then copies of the Memorial  
have been sent to them, & it is believed

That those who are in a position to do so are using <sup>their</sup> personal exertions - on behalf. Their Com<sup>o</sup> also has appointed one of their N<sup>o</sup>. to take part of the report & discuss, at the next Leg<sup>o</sup> hearing.

July - 8 - Special Com<sup>o</sup>: on re-organization of Dep<sup>o</sup>. met at 3 1/2 P.M. - present - all the members -

Voted, that, pending the effort now making by the Inst. to secure additional funds, no change be recommended in the scope or the organization of the Dep<sup>o</sup> of Science & Literature, & that the ~~same~~ departments of Botany, - Physics, Natural History, & Phil<sup>o</sup> be continued as on the Catalogue

Voted to recommend that the subjects of Paleontology, Zoology & Physiology - be combined under a single Professorship - to be called the Prof<sup>o</sup> of P & Z? & that the subjects of Geology & Geography be combined as a single Prof. to be called the Prof<sup>o</sup> of Geology & Geog<sup>o</sup>.


July 12 - 1878 - State Meeting of

ships, both the same as -




Voted. That the fees of the Special Class

Voted to recommend to the Govt.  
that all fees rec<sup>d</sup> from outside  
Spec. Students ~~shall~~ be paid directly  
into the Treasury & that the amt thus  
rec<sup>d</sup> be divided equally between  
the Prof & the Institute.
