My Dear Dr. Wiener:

I am exceedingly glad to receive your letter of Dec. the 18th and to learn that you are willing to change your mind, even if it is only out of friendship to me. I can assure you that I shall appreciate your action. I have taken steps to have all the Yiddish articles put in the department of Hebrew Literature which belongs to me, and I should be glad if you will write all the articles which come under the heading of "Yiddish Literature".

Unfortunately, the article on "Abramowitsch" had to be gotten in time, and upon your first refusal we wrote at once to Mr. Dubno in Russia and have received an article in Hebrew from that gentleman. I am sorry for this, but at least it will show you that we could not find any one besides yourself on this side of the water to do the work. I shall have the article translated and sent to you for revision, and if you so desire, we shall give you the same honorarium for revising the article as if you had written it yourself. Should you desire any other course to be pursued in regard to it, kindly express such a desire.

Will you not draw up a list of all articles dealing with Yiddish literature which occur in the letters a, b and c? Just as soon as I shall have passed on that list, I shall return it to you and you can, at your leisure, write the other articles, and also draw up lists for the other letters of the alphabet
